DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Pakistan Study Centre, University of Peshawar was established under the Act of Parliament in 1976. The Government through the University Grants Commission (now Higher Education Commission) and the Ministry of Education provided funds for the establishment of this Centre at the University of Peshawar. The University, therefore, went ahead with setting up a suitable building. The building is situated in beautiful surroundings on Road No.1, of the University, Gate No.4 close to office of the Controller of Examinations and Teaching Community Centre (TCC).

The Centre is functioning since February, 1979 as a unit academically attached to the University of Peshawar and financially linked to the Higher Education Commission, Islamabad. A Board of Governors and Academic bodies under the Act, control its administrative and academic performances. The Centre with grant from the HEC is gradually building up its teaching and research facilities and is assuming a shape befitting its status. It is publishing a research Journal "Pakistan" since winter 1979. The Journal has been recognized by HEC. The Centre enrolled first batch of students in its MA course in the Session 1980-81.

The M.Phil/Ph.D program were started in 2011. So far 15 batches have been inducted. The first ever PhD scholar was produced in 2014. Right now 27 PhD and 23 M.Phil scholars are busy in theses writing and course work.

The first ever 3 year progress report 2012-14 of the Centre was published in 2014. The report for 2020 is the 9th in a row. This report is going to give an overview of academic, research and co-curriculum activities during 2020. I am pleased to receive an encouraging response from Higher Education Commission (HEC), Vice Chancellor, University of Peshawar and Members of Board of Governors of the Centre, sister Centres, Departments, universities and other organizations from all over the country and abroad. It was that encouragement which enabled me to come up with a new report. I am grateful to Mr. Muhammad Ilyas Khan, and other staff members for helping me in making the task accomplished.

The Mission of Pakistan Study Centre is to develop human resource in the discipline of Pakistan studies so as to cater to the needs of government, private sector academia and society at large.

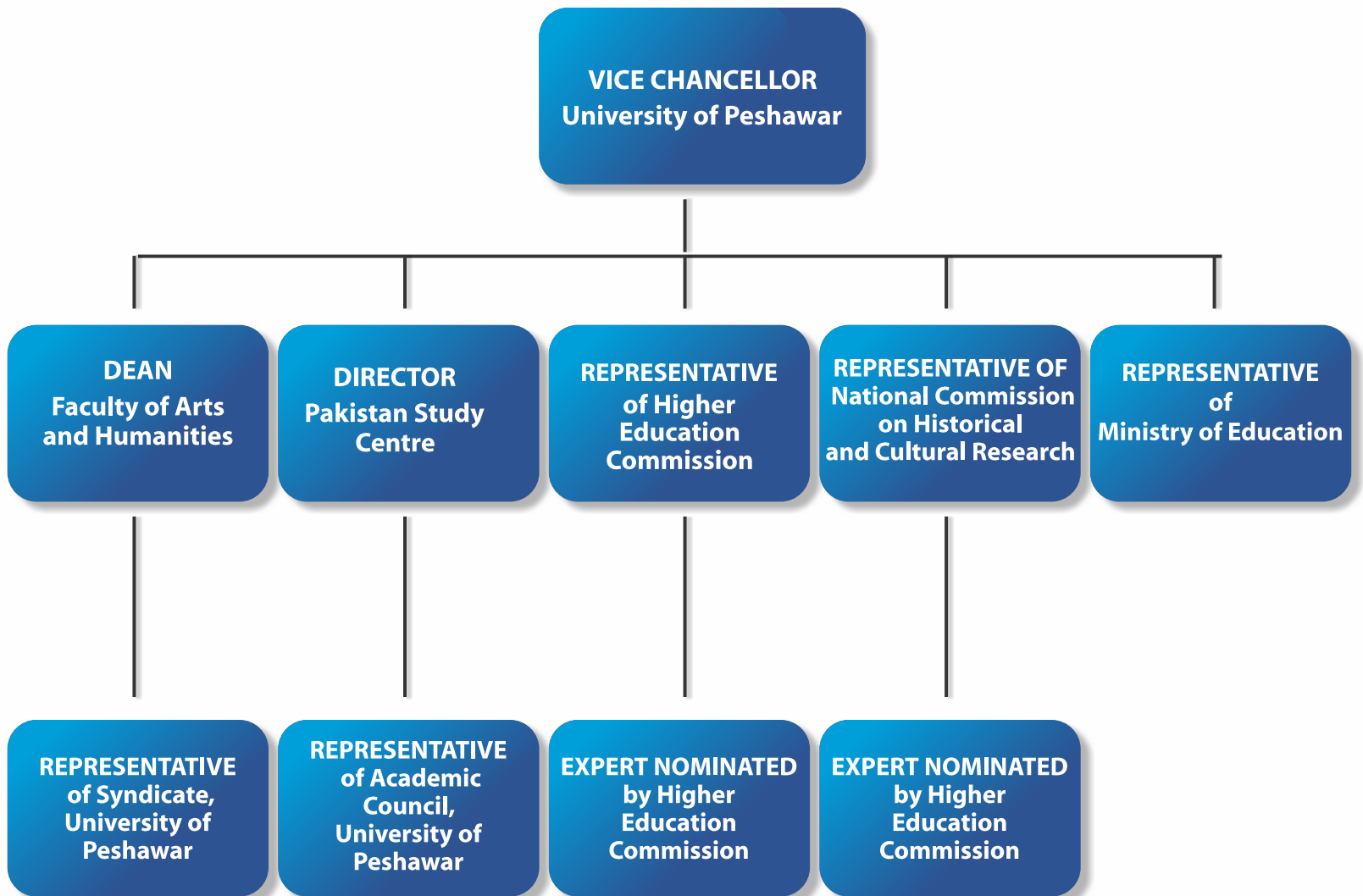
VISION

LIBRARY

Library of Pakistan Study Centre is one of the richest libraries of Peshawar University Campus. It has the collection of 20,000 books and 2000 unpublished theses. It caters to the needs of not only our own Master, M.Phil and Ph.D Students but students and scholars from other universities are also allowed to benefit from it. The library was automated in 2012 which made library activities such as search, circulation and acquisition quite easy. The Library has been renovated recently with provision of new racks and a circulation desk. For the first time Reading Room facility was provided. In 2018, a young and qualified Librarian was appointed. Recently library database has been updated and uploaded on local server for OPAC. It is now easy to access required contents in a systematic manner. The system will be soon extended and uploaded on internet. Annual verification of the books and other materials was carried out in 2020.

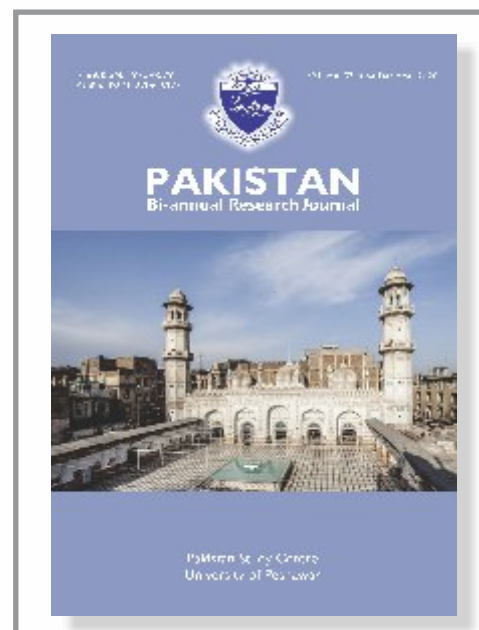
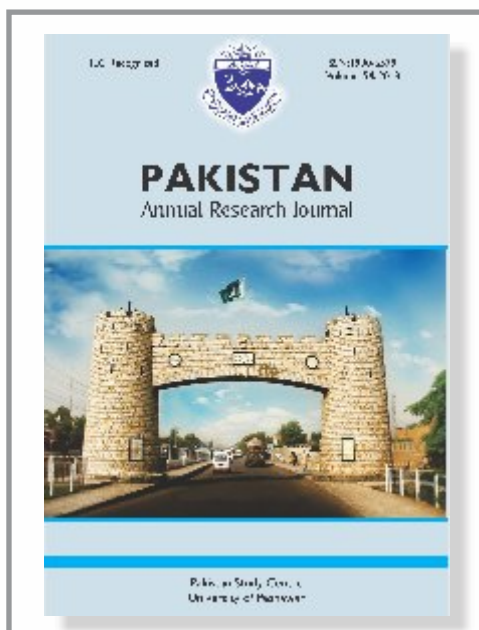
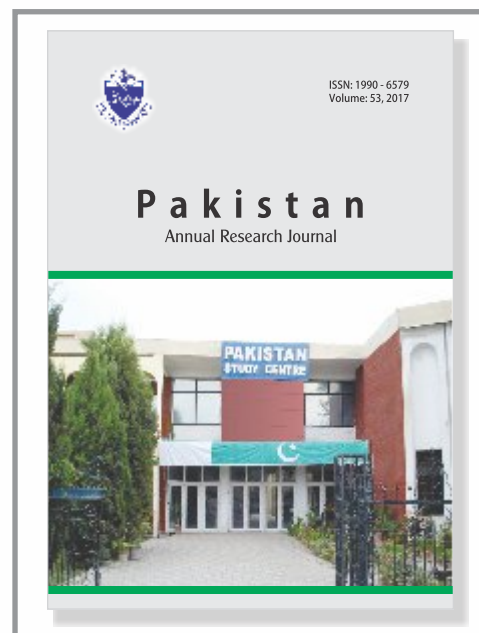
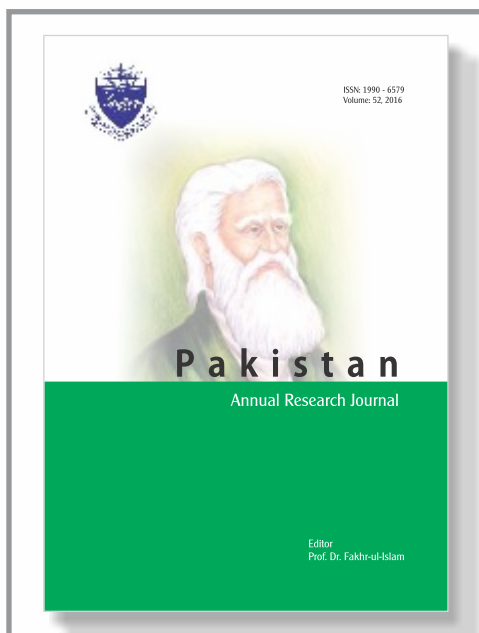

ONLINE CLASSES DURING COVID-19

Pakistan Study Centre promptly responded to challenges posed by Covid-19. Before embarking on regular online classes, by the University of Peshawar w.e.f 1st June 2020. Pakistan Study Centre had already started online education with the help of resources at its disposal. In an online faculty meeting in the second week of April, 2020, it was decided that course contents of all courses already offered will be uploaded on Centre's website. It was also decided that every faculty member will prepare power point presentations with recorded voices of all courses and those will be displayed on Centre's website. So it was in the mid of April 2020, that the process of uploading of power point presentations on Centre's website started. Students appreciated the availability of course contents and power presentations on their website. They started asking questions via SMSs, Whatsapp and Facebook groups which were timely answered. The positive result of our early embarkation on online education came in when the Centre started online education through Google Meet along with University of Peshawar w.e.f 1st June 2020. Our students had already benefitted from Power point presentation and they were familiar with the system. During April-May 2020, the Centre held 7 MA and one Ph.D viva online. Similarly 5 MPhil, 2 PhD and 3 MA vivas were held in June and July 2020.

As per instructions of the University of Peshawar authorities, the Director Pakistan Study Centre appointed Dr. Farmanullah, Assistant Professor to be the Focal Person for Online Teaching. Dr. Farmanullah, Academic Officer Muhammad Ilyas Khan and Junior Clerk Taimur Khan helped the faculty and students to understand technical and other aspects of the online teaching.

Pakistan Study Centre is running 04 academic programmes during the current semester. They are BS-4 year, MA, MPhil and PhD. The spring semester of all these programmes started in the first week of February 2020. Regular classes were held. The Centre had announced midterm examinations of all the programmes to the end of March 2020, however, due to COVID-19 closure of the University, these examinations were postponed. These examinations will now be held as per revised academic calendar given in the "University of Peshawar online Teaching and Assessment Policy During COVID-19"

Thanks to our beforehand preparations, we started online classes On 3rd June 2020 quite smoothly. Initial report in this regard was emailed to the honorable Vice Chancellor, Dean Faculty of Arts, Registrar and other concerned quarters.

Online classes at Pakistan Study Centre are going on smoothly. Attendance of students is ranging from 60 to 80 %. Other students are joining the system. Very few students from far-flung area like Chitral are not coming online presumably due to connectivity problems. Nevertheless, so far no one has formally informed the Centre about connectivity issue. The Centre will surely help them as per recently issued instructions by University of Peshawar. Students are enthusiastically taking part in online classes and are taking keen interest. They are well versed in using the technology and are extremely civilized and disciplined during the activity.

Pakistan Study Centre received "University of Peshawar online Teaching and Assessment Policy During COVID-19" today i.e. 10th June 2020. This document is greatly helpful and it is hoped that it will further facilitate the ongoing process.

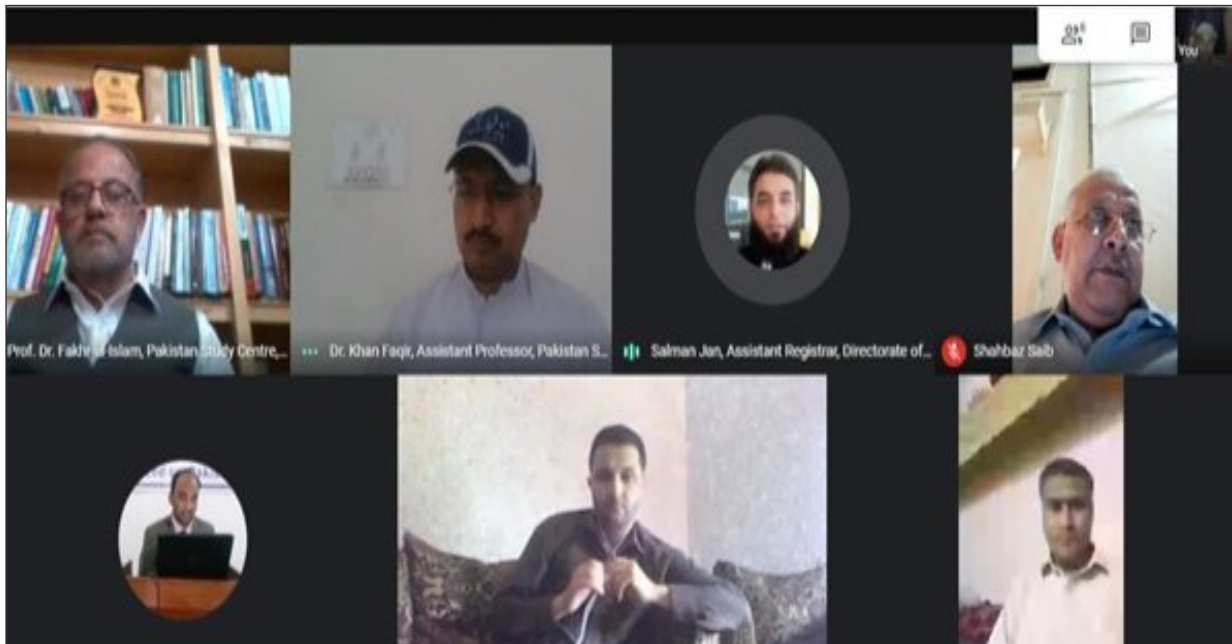

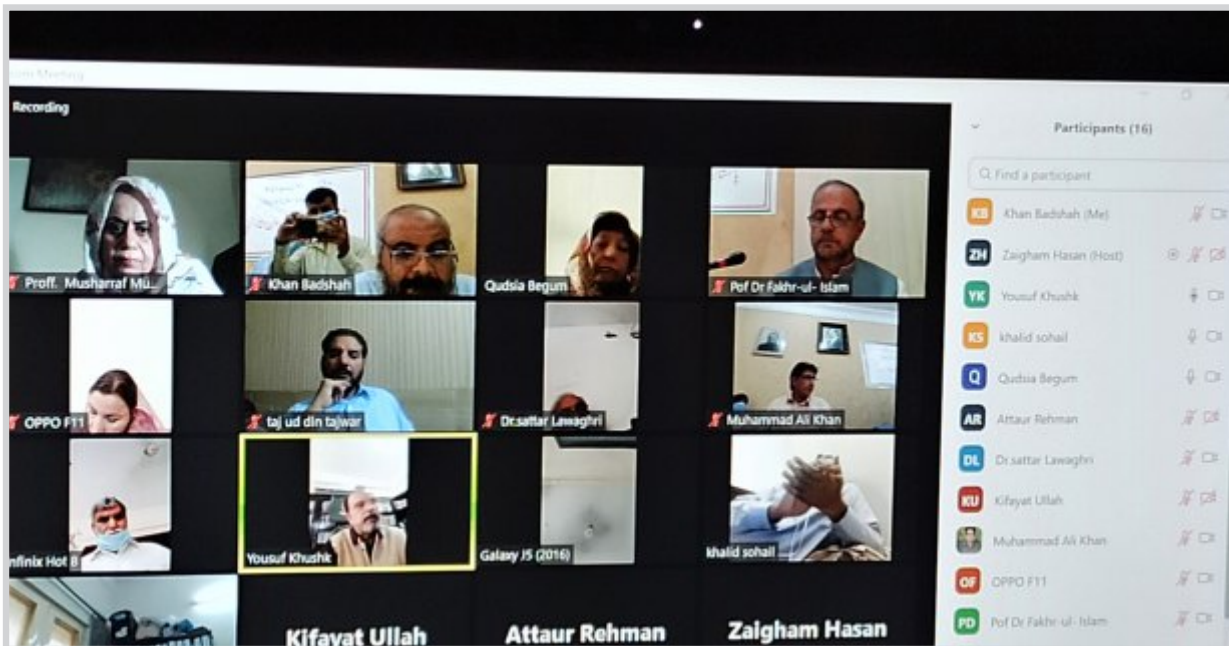

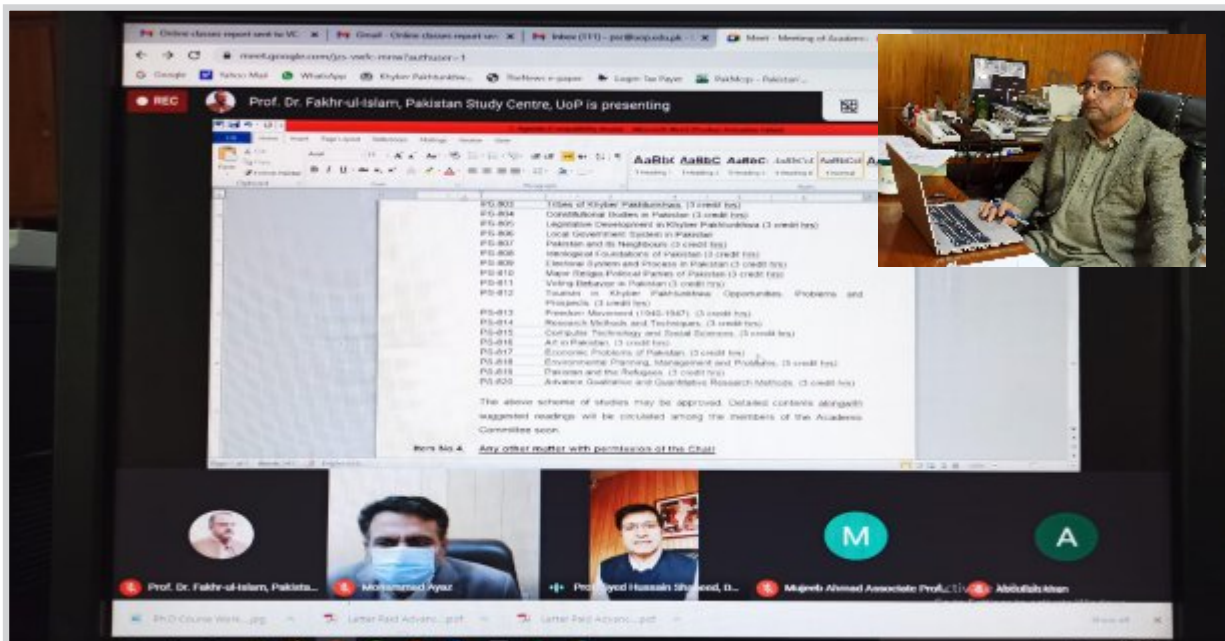
